



- Data protection, freedom of association and collective bargaining, health and safety at work and social security are needed.

- <u>Daraz</u> continued its expansion by becoming the most popular e-commerce brand in Bangladesh for the third year in a row.
- <u>Pathao</u> will set up a digital bank for its customers and employees as it is the largest growing gig economy platform in Bangladesh.
- <u>Foodpanda</u> has pledged to stay for long term in Bangladesh despite incurring losses of 25 million in 2022



- <u>Bangladesh</u> is estimated to be the **24th** largest economy in the world by **2030**.
- In Bangladesh, <u>85.1 %</u> of workers are employed in the informal economy (<u>43</u> % of Bangladesh's GDP).
- The gig economy in Bangladesh is generating **\$100 million a year** in revenue.
