None of the 12 platforms had policies in place to effectively **protect workers**. Some platforms provide safety measures, but there is <u>no</u> <u>evidence</u> that these are available to all workers.

Only <u>Glovo's **terms and conditions**</u> are clear, **transparent**, and governed by Nigerian rather than foreign law.

Glovo offers **due process** for <u>decisions</u> affecting workers and has effective **communication channels** in case of deactivation.

- 1. **Freelancing** was a <u>popular way of working</u> even before the pandemic.
- 2. Nigeria's **high unemployment rate** has <u>led</u> to an increase in gig work opportunities.
- 3. COVID-19 lockdowns have further accelerated this trend.
